Home Energy Squad Visits



To help customers increase energy savings and comfort throughout the year, Xcel Energy and CenterPoint Energy offer <u>Home Energy Squad</u>, either virtually (free) or in-home (which has a fee of \$100 for those making over \$100,000 annually). The in-home service starts with a no-cost virtual consultation by phone or video chat. Before the Squad even arrives at your home, you will be able to discuss specific details about your home with an energy expert. This helps to minimize time in your home and hone in on what matters most to you in terms of comfort and savings.

The in-person portion of the visit includes an insulation inspection, recommendations for increased efficiency and comfort, as well as the installation of energy-saving products such as LED bulbs, door weather-stripping, faucet aerators and a programmable or smart thermostat.

The Home Energy Squad is provided by Xcel Energy and CenterPoint Energy and delivered by Center for Energy and Environment, a local nonprofit. The service is available to owners and renters in buildings with 1-4 units. <u>Sign up online or call 651-328-6220 today!</u>

PRATT PTO asks for your support Goal \$10,000 by December 11!



Dear Parents, Guardians, Grandparents, and Friends,

We hope this letter finds you and your family happy, healthy, and safe. The Pratt Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) exists to facilitate family engagement and raise funds to support educational efforts not covered by Minneapolis Public Schools. Now more than ever, our students and teachers need your support to make distance learning as effective as possible for our kids.

Although we are all weathering the same storm, we are not all in the same boat. Some families in our community have been hit harder than others by illness, job loss, and other changes brought about by COVID-19. Some children in our community need more support than others – in the form of technology, time, and other resources – to have a positive and equitable distance learning experience.

Our goal is \$10,000 by December 11, 2020. Reaching this goal will allow us to create a fund of \$25 per Pratt student and \$100 per Pratt teacher. Student funds will be used to augment distance learning materials, based on needs identified by classroom teachers and specialists (Art, Enrichment, and Physical Education). Pratt teachers and school leaders are working hard to make sure all students have the same materials for class. We can use PTO funds to augment materials and minimize the amount that teachers are using their own money. Teacher funds will be used toward professional development and technology needs.

We know that some families are not in a position to give right now, but if you have the means, please consider making a donation to support our children's education. Pratt students do not sell goods to raise funds. Instead, the PTO asks for direct donations to maximize the dollars brought into the school. Donating to the Pratt PTO is the most direct way to support the teachers working so hard to adapt their teaching for virtual delivery, which allows us to keep our families safe.


Hey Prospect Park!
