Annual Garden Walk on June 26, 10am - 3pm "Healing the Earth"



For the past many years, the Prospect Park Garden Club has offered an opportunity to peek into neighbor's yards to see what they are doing with their gardens. This year, the Garden Club will partner with the Environment Committee to explore the theme "Healing the Earth." There will be an opportunity to see 9-10 gardens to get design ideas and growing tips as well as learn about additional ways to heal the earth through alternative sources of energy for houses and vehicles, reducing our carbon footprint. Participants can meet and talk to homeowners who have installed solar panels, heat pumps, use geothermal or mini-splits for heat sources or elect to drive electric cars or bikes. (Check out the opportunity to try an electric bike at the park at 29th Ave./4th St.). Save the date of Saturday, June 26 from 10am to 3 pm.

Check in will be at Pratt School where you can get a map, purchase plants from the Garden Club, or books from neighbor, Kent Petterson's Terrace Horticultural Books. Get out to see your neighbors, enjoy a beautiful day (we hope), and gather ideas for healing the earth.

Prospect Park Yard Sales June 26-27!



Given the latest round of loosening up of pandemic restrictions, especially as pertains to outdoor gatherings, it has been decided to resume the Yard Sales. However, participants are still encouraged to set up their displays and tables with proper social distancing spaces. Masks may still be appropriate too, depending on your individual situations.

Registrations are now open for this year's yard sales. **Note that the *Garden Club Plant Sale, Garden Club Garden Walk, and PPA Alternative Energy Displays * are also on Saturday, June 26,** so there will be lots of foot traffic that day.

With 3 weeks till the sale, now is a good time to start organizing your items. *A few hints: * Start setting aside sale stuff in your garage or a basement corner. Clean items that are dusty or dirty. Best if you put a price tag on them, by the item, by the box, etc., you can always negotiate price with buyer. Gather boxes and bags for shoppers to use.

REGISTRATION FEE: \$8 is required, (covers advertising/printing costs and gets you on the map flyer). *Cash or check- **make out to PPA** - accepted*. You'll get a receipt.



Photography Class at Luxton Park Community Center

Students of the Luxton Park Teen Program participated in a 9-week collaboration with community artist and photographer Kyra Nygard. The idea of the class is that storytelling is vital to a healthy, engaged, and connected community as well as related individuals. Join us to Discuss Orlin/Seymour Intersection

The Orlin/Seymour intersection by Tower Hill is an important public space in the neighborhood. The intersection is very wide, and better sight lines and crossing distances could make it safer for pedestrians and cars, and create additional public gathering spaces. At the May Transportation & Safety committee we discussed some possibilities and challenges (it's on a hill that gets slippery!). The next step is to meet AT the intersection to gather community input, and sketch ideas in chalk on the road.

A Backup Plan for Minnesota's "Solo Seniors" by Linda J. Camp - Weds, June 9, 1:30 - 3 pm

A growing portion of the 55+ population is composed of "solos." These are individuals who cannot or choose not to rely on family to help navigate life events and make health decisions. Health and well-being are concerns for everyone, but they are often the core concern in the second half of life. Planning is essential, but particularly those who cannot count on a family safety net. Many of us don't like to plan or know how to do it well. Existing planning tools tend to focus on the end of life, but neglect planning for health decisions and events that will likely occur during the "long middle." Come hear about solos and the special challenges they face. You'll hear about a new planning model and tool – the Backup Plan – and how it can help solos and others stay in the driver's seat in the second half of life.

Linda J. Camp is a consultant, writer, and researcher. Her work focuses on strategic planning, systems analysis, and change management for nonprofits and local government. Past work includes 28 years of management in the public sector and consulting related to older adults. She recently served as Project Manager for a Bush Foundation funded project on health decision making by/for solo older adults.

Recycling - What's the Deal? by Kim Erickson and Alex Kim - Wednesday, June 16, 1:30 - 2:30 pm


Learn key background on the history of recycling, hear up-to-date details on local recycling and organics rules, and participate in conversations to clear up common misconceptions about the recycling system.

Kim Erickson is successfully living a Zero Waste lifestyle, one that produces little to no garbage. She is passionate about helping individuals and communities achieve waste reduction. During her Zero Waste journey she has had the opportunity to co-found Zero Waste West Metro, speak in numerous communities, at the Minnesota capital, and facilitate environmental changes through communication with local government officials. Kim currently holds a position as an Inflight Sustainability Advocate through JetBlue Airways sustainability team based in New York City, and as Zero Waste West Metro Educator. She also a Hennepin County Master Recycler/Master Composter, as well as a St. Louis Park Recycle Champion. Alex Kim received his Master of Public Health degree in Environmental Health from the

University of Minnesota. He has been active in the pursuit of a more sustainable present and future by working with Abbott Northwestern Hospital to develop more environmentally friendly practices. He is currently an Environmental Health Specialist for the City of Brooklyn Park and has enjoyed being able to actively engage with the community and promote various sustainable practices within the city. He helps his fellow staff members live and work in a more sustainable manner by spearheading the Green Team. As a Hennepin County Master Recycler/Master Composter, he has also worked with various groups and individuals outside of work to provide presentations and education regarding the low waste lifestyle that have focused on reduction, reuse, and recycling at home as well as low waste grocery shopping tutorials.
